



# Remote Learning

## Parent Etiquette Year 3 - 6

### BEFORE YOU START

The remote learning environment still needs a series of rules to be set and followed like in a physical classroom.

- Setting up your child's learning space is important and one of the best ways to support remote learning
- Routines are important. Make sure students have had breakfast and are dressed (in sports shirt) ready for the start of each day.
- Have a quiet place where students can work – preferably at a desk.
- Ensure that they stop at recess and lunch for a break and get outside during the day for some exercise.

### ASSUMPTIONS CORE VALUES IN REMOTE LEARNING

#### Faith

During this time, it is important that we encourage our students to have faith in God's love and pray for an end to the turmoil in the world. Even in a Remote Learning environment, students will be participating in morning prayer with their class each morning when they log on for their class meeting.

#### Community

At ACPS we believe that community is vital in the development of positive and enriched relationships. In Remote Learning, collaboration can still occur through the OneNote and Teams apps. It is important that they stay in communication with their class members in an appropriate manner. All communications will be with respect, compassion and understanding.

#### Learning

Education is still important in a Remote Learning environment. We encourage parents to support their child's learning by maintaining the routines of school as much as possible. Each child will continue to strive to do their best with the support of their teacher and fellow classmates. Parents are encouraged to become actively involved in their child's education by asking questions, encouraging and assisting their child to problem solve.

#### Service

Making Jesus Real is an important part of our life at Assumption. We encourage students, even in a Remote Learning environment, to continue to model the behaviour that Makes Jesus Real in our community. They can do chores around the house, assist with younger siblings and acts of service within the family. Furthermore, the students must continue to display our values in the way that they communicate with others in the online environment – with respect and kindness.

## **TEACHER COMMUNICATION**

Your child will be able to communicate with their teacher between the hours of 8.30am and 3.00pm each day. They will commence each day with a class meeting through Teams. Your child can ask any questions during that time. For the remainder of the day communications should be through the Teams "posts" function. The teacher will answer their concerns.

If there are concerns regarding the Digital Technology, Passwords, Apps etc. you may lodge a request for assistance via [admin@assumption.wa.edu.au](mailto:admin@assumption.wa.edu.au) You will then be contacted via email or by phone to assist you with your issue. This can be a tricky time navigating a form of education that is foreign to most of us. We are here to assist you to make the transition as seamless as possible for you and your students.

## **ATTENDANCE**

Students are required to join their class meeting at 9.00am to have their attendance registered. If you are not able to login at 9.00am please let your class teacher know.

## **ETIQUETTE IN TEAMS CALLS**

When students are online during a Teams Class Meeting, they have been instructed to blur their backgrounds to prevent distractions on the screen. Whilst we encourage, where possible, for parents to be involved in students' Remote Learning, we do ask that you support students' listening and participating in the Class Meeting. This means not talking to them whilst they are in the Class Meeting and eliminating distractions and other surround sounds during that time.

## **SAFETY ONLINE**

We care about our students being online and learning. The students have been learning about Online Safety and being good Digital Citizens. This continues when the student is in a Remote Learning Environment. It is important that you check that the student is learning in the appropriate environment and encourage them to make good choices when they are posting online.
