#### Developing the whole person

- Implementation of the new Evangelisation Plan with staff
- Consolidate the MJR program to ensure a disciplined, safe and supportive environment for all
- Embed the Nagle Charism within the school community
- A focus on wellbeing and resilience as a foundation for learning readiness
- Introduction of service learning
- Quality teaching in Religious Education

#### Improve student academic achievement

- Establish orderly learning environments and high expectations of all
- Implement an agreed whole school evidence based explicit teaching approach to Literacy and Numeracy
- All students to grow at least 0.4 effect size (Hattie: one year of growth for each year of learning)
- Increased evidence of differentiated teaching practice
- All programs in the school are evidence and research based

#### Build Staff Capacity

- Consolidate the coaching model as a performance support and development strategy
- Develop consistent delivery of evidence-based teaching practices
- Consolidation of the Extended Leadership Team
- Increase staff collaboration and peer sharing of "best practice" through Observation Chairs, Shoulder to Shoulder, Case Conferencing
- High quality professional development to build collective capacity related to whole school priorities

#### Promote a Culture of Positive Accountability

- Improve and support the development of staff instructional capacity
- Introduce policies and processes that support staff growth and performance
- Introduction of evidence-based extension programs from Year One
- Capital development Plan for the Years 3-6 block
- Increase outreach to Aboriginal families and local community
