On Tuesday 18 July, we celebrate NAIDOC Week. The theme this year is "For our Elders." During this week we celebrate and recognise the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC Week is an opportunity for all Australians to learn about First Nations cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures on earth. During this week, our students will be immersed in a number of activities and experiences that will enrich their understanding of our First Nation's culture.

A Focus on the Child Safe Framework

This week we continue the focus on the CEWA Childsafe Framework that all schools implement. Three Key Practices quide the framework:

Situational prevention

Situational prevention involves all of us constantly evaluating our total environment to minimise opportunities of risk, bringing the hidden into the open. The focus is on creating safe environments.

Extended guardianship

Extended guardianship is about all adults understanding their responsibility within the school community and having respectful conversations regarding unwanted behaviours we see, and the need for staff, parents and students to follow our Code of Conduct to ensure we create a culture where our students are heard, are safe and can thrive.

Healthy and respectful relationships

DID YOU KNOW?




Recently I travelled to Darwin as part of the WA girls under 12 State Cricket Team where we competed against all the other states and territories in Australia.
