Students are to arrive at school before class commences

The gates open at 8.30am. Students should have time before the school day commences, to hang their school bag and bring any items they require for the day into the classroom, including their drink bottle.

Late Arrivals

Children who arrive late for school must be signed in by their parent or carer at the



administration office before proceeding to the classroom.

Absentees

If your child has been ill overnight, please do not send them to school.

Unwell children should be kept at home and given time to recuperate.

If your child becomes ill during the day, you will be notified and asked to collect your child and care for them at home.

When a student is absent from school an absentee note can be submitted through SEQTA Engage.

Attendance

Children must attend school every day.

Families are requested to refrain from booking holidays during school time.

It is important to note the link between non-attendance and lower academic outcomes.

Arrival and Departure Procedures

Where to Park

The car park for parents is located at the rear of the school on Oakmont Avenue.

Please do not park vehicles in the area designated for dropping off and picking up students.

Parents are requested to reverse park so that when leaving, vision is clear, and all of our children are safe.

There is a second car park located at the front of the school on Gordon Road. Please note this is for the use of staff only.


Bus Travel

Parents can arrange for their children to use Transperth public transport.

School Bus Services are available for students outside of the public transport areas. Students are supervised until 3.15pm.

Please Note

Children are **not** permitted to leave the school grounds during school hours without prior written communication from the parent or carer.





Bicycles and Scooters

Students must wear a helmet when riding.

We recommend storing and locking bicycles and scooters at the rack located outside the Year One Red classroom.

Children under the age of 16 years are not permitted (by law) to ride electric scooters to school.


Students are not permitted to ride through the school grounds.

Placing a Canteen Order

Our Crunchy Carrot canteen is open on **Wednesday**, **Thursday** and **Friday**, and is organised by the canteen co-ordinator who is assisted by volunteers.

The menu is available from the canteen and online.

Afternoon recess and lunch orders must be placed **before 8.00am** online at assumption.wa.edu.au/families.

Orders are sent to each classroom before the lunch break commences.

Animals

Animals are not permitted into the school at any time during the school day, including before and after school.

CDFPay

A cash-free online payment platform, CDFPay is used when placing canteen orders and for purchases related to various events throughout the year.

For families who require outside school hours care for their children in the morning or afternoon, we are fortunate to have OSHClub on our school grounds.

Personal Property

Please label everything brought to school with your child's name.

Belongings may go missing and if items are labelled there is a good chance they will be returned.

It will also assist your child on their journey to identify their own property.

On **Free Dress Days** clothes and footwear need to be appropriate to the occasion and hair must be tied up and off the face.

The Assumption fleece vest and navy blue scarf are optional.

Grooming

- Clothing should be clean and in a good state of repair
- Nail polish and makeup is not permitted
- Clear lip balm/gloss may be worn

Hair

- Hair longer than collar length is to be tied back away from the face
- Hair accessories must be navy or school check / plaid
- When wearing the House shirt, hair accessories can match
 block colours only
- Moderate haircuts in No. 2 or above are permitted
- No hair colouring or extreme haircuts including No. 1 haircuts or chiselled pattern hair styles, undercuts, dreadlocks, cut outs, mohawks, rats tails, mullets
- No hair wraps and or bead / coloured braiding unless culturally appropriate, and at the discretion of the principal

Jewellery

- Wristwatch is permitted
- No smartwatches as per ICT User Agreement
- Small plain gold or silver sleepers or round studs can be worn

 one in the lobe of each ear. No stones, jewels or decorative earrings.
- One chain with a religious symbol can be worn under clothing
- Rings, bracelets, wristbands, loombands are not permitted

Little Kwilena

Our Little Kwilena Playgroup provides a warm and inviting atmosphere for Aboriginal families. Little ones can explore, learn, and children and adults have the opportunity to connect.

In a supportive environment, caregivers, Aboriginal Families as First Educators (AFaFE) facilitators and the Family Liaison Officer encourage children from birth **up** to five years old to express themselves freely, ask questions, and discover the world around them, laying the foundation for lifelong learning and growth.

Where & When

The playgroup takes place every **Wednesday** and **Thursday** during the school term between **9.30am** and **11.30am** in our early childhood area.

There is **no charge** to attend Little Kwilena Playgroup.

Where and When

Kindergarten takes place each Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of the school term between 8.45am and 2.55pm.

Pre Primary

First Compulsory Year of Schooling

Attendance at Pre Primary level is compulsory and operates full days, **Monday to Friday**.

Please supervise your child until the classroom door opens at **8.30am**.

Children are expected to be collected at **2:55pm** from the Pre Primary classroom by a parent or their carer.

Please try to ensure that children are collected on time, as they can become upset if their parent or carer is late.

Please do not allow them to play on the playground equipment before or after school.

Kindergarten to Year Six



Evidence Based Education

An emphasis is placed on high impact instruction and student engagement.

We use evidence based practices to ensure high quality teaching and learning across all year levels.

English

The English program includes reading, speaking, viewing, listening and writing. Each of these is integrated into other subject areas.

To support learning, we incorporate the Letters and Sounds phonics program, and Spelling Mastery into daily teaching.



The passionate and engaging educators at Assumption deliver an exceptional evidence-based learning program



Mathematics

Our Mathematics program focuses on the use of developmental activities in all grades.

The strands of number and algebra, measurement and geometry, statistic and probability are an integral part of the program and are incorporated into other subject areas.

Utilising Prime Mathematics enhances the delivery of our curriculum.

Humanities and Social Sciences

These subjects focus on peoples' wellbeing, their interaction with each other, the environment and technology.

The children are encouraged to develop a respect for cultural heritage and a commitment to social justice.

Physical Education and Health

Our Physical Education program gives the children the opportunity to develop enthusiasm for physical activities and skills, confidence and co-ordination in the use of equipment.



Science

Our specialist science teacher focuses on developing students scientific inquiry skills through a range of stimulating learning experiences.



Technologies

The use of digital technologies is integrated across all learning areas.

Years Six students require an iPad for use in the classroom on a daily basis.

When students are accessing online platforms, we emphasise the need to 'Make Jesus Real' online as well as in reality.





Language Other Than English

Our school has a specialist educator to teach Auslan (Australian Sign Language) to boys and girls of all ages; beginning from Kindergarten.

In addition to supporting deaf and hard of hearing children in the local community, learning this vibrant and expressive language, promotes conversations with students about recognising and celebrating the many differences that exist among individuals.

The Arts

We have a specialist visual art teacher. The children learn art skills and techniques in an environment focussed on creativity.

Choir

Our school choir is made up of students from Year Four to Year Six.

Students have regular choir practice for school liturgies and family masses. Opportunities are available for students to perform in festivals and school events.




Camps and Excursions

Religious Education



Central to the whole Curriculum

The school's Religious Education (RE) program is systematic and sequenced to help children relate the Catholic Faith to their daily lives. School and class liturgies are celebrated regularly. Students engage in various creative activities in RE, based on the Western Australian Religious Education Units of Work, for a minimum of half an hour each day.

Retreat and reflection opportunities are provided for all students. The Catholic school is seen to be part of the parish and the broader church. Our Parish Priest actively participates in the faith life of our school.

Sacraments

The Sacraments are Parish based, family and school supported and include Reconciliation in Year Three, Eucharist in Year Four and Confirmation in Year Six.



Parents are the prime educators of their children and the school's Religion Program is only as effective as parental examples, and support in the home environment. Family prayer and attendance at weekend Mass do much to help the child integrate the faith into their daily lives.

Pastoral Care

Our school recognises and respects the individuality of each child, and each staff member is charged with a pastoral role. We encourage students to be considerate and thoughtful of others to help promote and maintain a positive self-esteem among children.

Communication Tools and Channels

SEQTA Engage

The primary means of communication between teachers and families is via SEQTA Engage.

At enrolment, our administrative assistant would have arranged for a welcome email to be sent to you providing instructions on how to use this communication App.

If you need further assistance, please call, email or visit the administration office.

SeeSaw

The SeeSaw App is a digital platform to show families what students have been learning throughout the year.



Weekly Happenings

The Weekly Happenings email is sent each Thursday to provide families with a snapshot and reminders of what is occurring at school the following week.

eNewsletter

On the last Thursday of each month of the school term, a newsletter is emailed to families communicating messages from the principal, upcoming important dates and events, religious and Parish updates, and news from all areas of our school community.

Photos of each class and of special events during the year are displayed in a printed Yearbook and distributed to families in Term Two of the following year.

Communication between Families and Teachers



First Point of Contact

The classroom or specialist teacher is the first point of contact for all matters related to your child's achievement or wellbeing.

Families who call the administration office to discuss an issue related to their child will be directed to meet with the teacher in the first instance.

If a concern or issue remains unresolved, it will be directed to an Assistant Principal for follow up.

Communicating with Teachers

Families must use SEQTA Engage for all classroom communication including arranging an appointment to discuss concerns in person or over the phone.

Please include a brief description of the concern to allow teachers adequate time to collect pertinent information.

Allow 48 hours (Monday to Friday) for a reply to any

communication sent to teachers.

Sometimes there may be a delayed reply due to teacher absences or illness.

Allowances also need to be made for teachers who work part time.

Emails will be responded to between the hours of 8.00am and 4.00pm, Monday to Friday. No responses will occur over the weekend or during school holidays.

All matters regarding after school collection of children should be directed to the administration office.

Teachers are busily preparing their day and welcoming students into the classroom between 8.30am to 8.45am. This is not an appropriate time to discuss matters other than general housekeeping, due to the teacher's duty of care requirements.

Teacher / Caregiver Interviews

Interviews are conducted at mid-way in Term One.

These interviews are a crucial time for forward planning in relation to your child and the rest of the year.

Families are encouraged to book a meeting with teachers at anytime should they have any concerns or queries.

Reports are issued twice a year - mid-year (end of Term Two) and at the end of Term Four.

Student's reports are made available to student's caregivers via SEQTA Engage.

Information Evening

There is an information evening for each year level early in Term One. Class teachers will outline the curriculum, explain the class timetable, procedures, and answer any queries.





Assemblies

Morning briefings are held on Monday at 8.45am over the PA, and assemblies are held regularly on Friday afternoons in the Presentation Centre.

Parents are given advance notice of assemblies via our the calendar on our website and eNewsletters.

Change of Contact Details

Please inform the administration office immediately of any change of details, including your address, phone number and the principal of any change in family circumstances.





Code of Conduct Expectations



All parents, teachers, volunteers and visitors are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct, as follows.

- 10. You maintain and build on the community's trust and confidence in Catholic schools and the Church.
- 11. You act reflectively and ethically.
- 12. You allow students to have a voice in their education, safety and well-being.


